- 3 Articles will not be accepted, nor returned, by post.
- 4 All exhibits must remain on display during the show.
- 5 The Pavilion will close at 4pm on Sunday and exhibits are to be collected not earlier than 5.30pm until 6.30pm (excepting Schools, see page 16).
- 6 Exhibitors must produce their portion of the entry form when delivering and collecting exhibits.

- 1 Stewards have the right to transfer any exhibit to its correct class if they believe it has been entered incorrectly.

HANDY HINTS

DECORATED SAUCER

Use a saucer, fill with damp sand and smooth off to a slightly domed finish. The saucer should then be completely covered with flowers and foliage to form a pattern. Colour blending, pattern, scale and finish are very important with no sand showing.

FLOWERS FOR THE (DINING) TABLE Should be equally beautiful from all sides. It should not be so high as to interfere with conversation across the table. Accessories such as candles are allowed.
