- The Exhibition Pavilion is open from 1.30pm to 7.30pm on Wednesday 8th November to accept all art & craft exhibits. JUDGING DAY IS THURSDAY.
- 2. Horticulture to be delivered Friday, November 10th from 1 pm to 5pm (sharp).
- 3. Articles will not be accepted, nor returned, by post.
- 4. All exhibits must remain on display during the show.
- The Pavilion will close at 4pm on Sunday and exhibits are to be collected not earlier than 5.30pm until 6.30pm (excepting Schools, see STUDENT/SCHOOL SECTION).

6. Exhibitors must produce their portion of the entry form for identification when delivering and collecting exhibits.

RULES:

- 1. Stewards have the right to transfer any exhibit to its correct class if they believe it has been entered incorrectly.
- 2. Stewards take all care, but the Society does not accept responsibility for any damages/loss that may occur.
- 3. Judge's decision is final.




